2007 FEATURED CLINIC SPEAKERS



RICK MAJERUS - ESPN ANALYST

Success has followed Rick Majerus through every step of his coaching career. In 32 years in the profession as a head coach and an assistant coach, Majerus has been part of 734 victories, 27 post season appearances, an N.I.T. Final Four appearance, three NCAA Final Four appearances, and one National Championship.

After coaching at Marquette, the NBA Milwaukee Bucks, Ball State and Utah, Rick has become one of the most recognizable personalities in college basketball as a key analyst on ESPN. He can be seen

and heard by millions during the college basketball season on national television and syndicated radio shows. He lent his expertise as an analyst to CBS during the NCAA tournament coverage in 1999 and also worked the Final Four.

Rick is in high demand as a speaker at conferences and coaching clinics across the country. He also hosted his own basketball camp at the University of Utah. An average of more than 2000 kids from grades 1 - 12 attended the camp on a yearly basis. Rick will be talking about his 4 out 1 in motion offense.



STEVE RIDDER - EMBRY RIDDLE UNIVERSITY

Coach Ridder has posted 20 win seasons in 13 of his 17 years at Embry Riddle University an average of 25 wins a season since 1991. During the 1999-2000 season, the Eagles reached the NAIA Pinnacle claiming the program's first National Championship. The Eagles followed up that season with the program's best ever record (32-4) and were ranked #1 in the nation from wire to wire.

Under Ridder's guidance the Eagles qualified for the NAIA National Tournament nine times, including six in

a row from 1996-2001. Last season the Eagles made it back to the National Championship for the second consecutive year posting the best winning percentage in school history, (91%) 31-3.

Coach Ridder has brought excitement, exposure, and national recognition to Embry Riddle University. He has received numerous coach of the year awards including NAIA National Coach of Year in 2000. During his 17 years at Embry Riddle, Ridder's record is 372-161 (70%). Coach Ridder will speak about "Building a Special Program".



ROY GARDNER AWARD

Jerry is a graduate of Ball State University and received his administrative degree from Indiana State University. For 23 years he taught swimming at Fountain Central High School and was Assistant Principal at Western Boone High School from 2001 - 2006.

During his 33 year officiating career, Taylor worked 22 sectionals, 17 regionals, eight semistates, four state finals (two single class and two class), two Hall of Fame, and one Tournament of Champions games. Jerry has served in numerous leadership roles as a member of the Western

Officials Association out of Lafayette. He also serves as an IHSAA observer and was the recipient of the Outstanding Official award in 1996. Jerry would like to thank several people for their help during his successful officiating career. First is Zack Williams, IHSAA observer and good friend. Others include Larry Nixon his partner for 20 years and all the Athletic Directors and coaches he worked with. He would especially like to thank his family-Mary, Kyle and Megan-for the time he was not home

DON MEYER - NORTHERN STATE UNIVERSITY

Coach Meyer last spoke at the IBCA Clinic in 1999. Since then he has moved to fifth on the all time wins list with 855 victories during a 35 year coaching career. This ranks him right behind well known Hall of Fame coaches Adolph Rupp, Dean Smith and Bob Knight.

Meyer coached teams have won 20 or more games 25 times during his 35 year coaching career. This included an NAIA National Championship while coaching at David Lipscomb University in Nashville

Tennessee.

Coach Meyer is respected nationally as one of the great teachers of the game. In nine years well over 10,000 coaches from all over the nation have attended the Don Meyer Coaches' Academy. Featured speakers at the Academy reads as a who's who of outstanding coaches from Pat Summit to John Wooden.

Coach Meyer also produces instructional books and a 30-tape series "Building a Championship Program" that has helped coaches at every level from high school to the NBA. He has also given motivational speeches throughout the country and has published numerous articles for many coaching publications. Coach Meyer will speak about "The Best Things I Have Seen in Basketball".



SHARON VERSYP - PURDUE UNIVERSITY

Coach Versyp is a 1989 graduate of Purdue and returns to her Alma Mater after one season as the head coach at Indiana University. She led the Hoosiers to a 19-14 record and a 9-7 Big Ten record during the 2005-2006 season.

Before coming to IU, Coach Versyp was the head coach at Maine from 2000 to 2005. She posted a 98-51 record while leading the Black Bears to back-to-back-to-back American East regular season championships in her last three seasons. In recognition of her efforts Versyp was named America East

Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2005.

Before entering the collegiate ranks, Versyp coached high school basketball at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis from 1989-1993. She then coached at Benton Central from 1993 to 1996.

As a high school player at Mishawaka High School, Versyp was named the 1984 Indiana Miss Basketball. She went on to have an outstanding career at Purdue University where she is still listed in the top ten of numerous statistical categories.

Coach Versyp and her staff has led the Boilermakers to a 23-5 regular season record and a #13 national ranking. The Boilermakers were the 2007 Big Ten Tournament Champions. In six seasons as a head coach, Versyp owns a 120-65 overall record.

2007 GIRLS COACHES OF THE YEAR



GARY COLLINS

DISTRICT I - MICHIGAN CITY

Coach Collins has coached numerous boys' and girls' sports during his career at Washington Twp., Portage, Westville and Michigan City High Schools. He has been the head coach at Michigan City since 2002. His 2006-2007 record was 22-2. Winners of their holiday tournament, they were defeated in their sectional by eventual 4A class champion South Bend Washington. Coach congratulations on an outstanding year.



KEN MARKFUL

DISTRICT I - ANDREAN

Coach Markful has just completed his 9th year as head coach at Andrean. He was JV coach four years before that. In 2002, he was selected the ICGSA 3A Coach of the Year and this past year he was selected Lake Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. This past season Coach led the Fighting 59ers to an 18-5 record. They were Lake Athletic Conference Champions and Wheeler Tournament Champions. During his career at Andrean,

they have won three Conference, four Sectional and one Regional Championships. His overall record is 134-73. Coach congratulations on a successful season.



STEVE DRABYN DISTRICT II - AVON

Coach Drabyn is a 29 year coaching veteran. He spend 2 years at Ben Davis Junior High and 21 years at La Porte. The past six years he has coached at Avon. This past season Drabyn led the Orioles to the Hendricks County Championship, a 20-3 record and a state ranking as high as third in the 4A poll. Congratulations Coach!



TODD LAW
DISTRICT II - OAK HILL

Coach Law has been a Guidance Counselor and the Girls Basketball coach at Oak Hill since 2004. During that time he has led the Lady Eagles to a 46-22 record.

This past year was a season of firsts for the Lady Eagles. They were Sectional and Regional Champs for the first time in school history and advanced to the Final Four. Their FT% 71% and offense average 62 points per game were the best in

school history. They defeated seven teams that were ranked in the Top 20. The Lady Eagles were ranked third in the state poll with a record of 24-2. Congratulations Coach, you led the Lady Eagles to an outstanding season of accomplishments.



JIM ROSE
DISTRICT III - BLOOMFIELD

In 2003 Coach Rose became the Girls' Basketball Coach at Bloomfield High School. In his second season he led the Cardinals to the Semi-State before losing to Northeast Dubois. This past season the Cardinals were rated #1 in

the 1A poll before losing in the Regional Championship. During the past three seasons, Rose has led Bloomfield to three Sectionals, one Regional and two consecutive undefeated SWIAC Championships. His three year record is 61-13. Coach congratulations. You have done a good job building a successful program at Bloomfield.



GREG WERNER

DISTRICT III - SOUTHRIDGE

Coach Werner led the Raiders to a 22-2 record this season and a 2A Top 10 Ranking before bowing out in the Regional Championship to Mitchell. During his coaching career, Werner led teams have won two PAC Conference Championships (2005 and 2007), two Sectional Championships (1999 and 2007) plus a Regional Championship in 1999. His 2005 Raider team finished the regular season undefeated. Coach

Werner is 61-7 during his three year career at Southridge. Coach, you have led your Raiders on a good run the past three years.

TRAVIS HANNAH

DISTRICT I - OREGON-DAVIS

Coach Hannah took over at Oregon-Davis in 2002 after the Bobcats had gone 0-42 the previous two seasons. The Bobcats went 1-19 in his first year as head coach. Five years later the Bobcats finished the regular season 20-1. Last season Oregon-Davis advanced to the 1A Semi-State. Coach Hannah has led the Bobcats to three Athletic Conference Championships (2004-2006) and two conference regular season champion-

ships (2006&2007). Coach, congratulations you have done a great job turning your program around.



BOB PUNTER

DISTRICT I - VALPARAISO

Coach Punter has been a mathematics teacher in Valparaiso Community Schools since 1969. He became the Varsity Boys' Basketball coach in 1989. During his career, he has also coached track, football, and girls golf. In 1994, he led the Vikings to an undefeated regular season and a State Runner Up finish. He has won numerous Coach of the Year awards and in 2003 was selected as an Indiana All-Star Coach. At various

times this past season his Vikings have been ranked #1 in the AP and Coaches' Polls and finished the regular season 20-2. His varsity coaching career record is 298-116. Congratulations! Coach, you have had an outstanding career.



DAVID McCollough

DISTRICT II - NOBLESVILLE

This is Coach McCollough's second IBCA Coach of the Year honor. During his career his teams have won ten Conferences, seven Sectionals, one Regional and one Hall of Fame Championship. He has coached two Indiana All-Stars, has served as an Indiana All-Star Coach and is a past president of the IBCA. This past season the Millers were 20-3 and Hamilton County Champions. Coach McCollough is 211-80 in 13 years at Noblesville. Con-

MARK JAMES

DISTRICT II - FRANKLIN CENTRAL

This is Coach James' second selection as an IBCA District Coach of the Year, his first coming in 1995-96. He has led the Flashes program the past 22 years. His teams are known for their work ethic, self-discipline and their fundamentally sound approach to playing the game the way it is supposed to be played. James has led the Flashes to five Sectional, five Conferences and two Marion County Championships. The Flashes finished the regular

season at 20-2 and were ranked #1 in the state at various times. Congratulations Coach! You have had an outstanding career.



TOM BRADLEY

DISTRICT III - ORLEANS

For the past eight years, Bradley has coached at Orleans. Going into this year's tournament his teams have won five PLAC Conference, four Sectional and one Regional Championships. Coach has led the Bulldogs to four straight 20 win seasons. The Bulldogs finished the regular season at 17-3 and were ranked #3 in class 1A. His career record is 144-52 (74%). Super Job Coach!



JAY BROWN

DISTRICT III - EDGEWOOD

Coach Brown is a graduate of Edgewood High School and Indiana University. He has coached all 21 years at Edgewood, 14 as an assistant coach, three years as the Varsity Girls' coach and is finishing his fourth season as the Boys' Varsity coach.

During his tenure as the boys' coach, the Mustangs have won three consecutive Western Indiana Conference Championships and a sec-

tional title. Going into the 2007 state tournament, the Mustangs were ranked #1 in class 3A in the AP poll and sixth overall in the IBCA Coaches' Poll. The Mustangs also finished off their first perfect season in school history at 20-0. Coach, congratulations on your perfect regular season.

VIRGIL SWEET DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD RECIPIENTS

Each year the IBCA Board of Directors selects individuals from each of the three IBCA Districts to receive the Virgil Sweet Distinguished Service Award. The award, named in honor of long-time Executive Director of the IBCA, are given to individuals who have provided meritorious service in the promotion of basketball in the state of Indiana.

The seven recipients featured below will receive their awards during the IBCA clinic Friday, April 27, 2007.



DISTRICT I - TOM REHM

Tom has been a volunteer coach for a number of years for the CYO, YMCA and the Bishop Luers Girls' Basketball program where he started a very successful feeder program. His daughter Nancy is a member of the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame. He worked with her for many hours during her high school career. Tragically, her college career was cut short in 1982 when she was murdered. In her honor, the Nancy Rehm Border Wars Basketball Tournament was started. This tournament has helped generate millions of dollars for basketball scholarships in Northeast Indiana. The Nancy Rehm

Memorial award is given to a pioneer of Girls Basketball. Pat Summit, Muffit McGraw, Christi Curry, and Pat Roy have been recipients of this award through the years.

In 2002, the Governor of Indiana presented Tom with the Sagamore of the Wabash award for his dedication and efforts in helping student athletes through the Nancy Rehm Border Wars Tournament. Tom, thanks for all your contributions to high school basketball.



DISTRICT II - JUDI WARREN

In the history of Indiana High School Basketball Judi has had a career of firsts. She played on the first Girls' State Championship team at Warsaw in 1976. She was also the first Girls Miss Basketball and Mental Attitude winner. After high school she led Franklin to three small college state championships and has been inducted into the Franklin College Hall of Fame. During her coaching career at South Dearborn, Maconaguah, and Carmel High School her teams won 14 Sectionals, two Regionals, and were state runner up in 1995. Judi has received

numerous honors. She was an assistant Indiana All-Star Coach and the Head Indiana All-Star Coach in 1993. She has been an IBCA District Coach of the Year. In 2002 she was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame. Currently Judi is an elementary teacher at Mohawk Trails Elementary in Carmel and serves on the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame Board. Judi, congratulations on your contributions to the tradition of Indiana High School Basketball.



DISTRICT III - CLIFF GUILLIAMS

Cliff graduated from the University of Southern Indiana with degrees in radio-television and speech. He began writing sports for the Evansville Courier & Press in 1978.

His sports writing beat carries him from the big gyms of Evansville, Vincennes and Washington to the smaller venues at Barr-Reeve and Loogootee where the enthusiasm is no less. He previously has covered the state championship runs of Vincenes Lincoln and Evansville Bosse and more recently

Forest Park.

During the spring and summer, Guilliams covers horse racing for the paper and on the first Saturday of each May, Cliff will be found in the press box at the Kentucky Derby.

In 2001, Guilliams authored "Final Calls to Absent Friends", a compilation of his columns bidding farewell to athletes and horses who had passed on. He considers the boys' Indiana High School Basketball Tournament unmatched in sports for

INDIANA ALL STARS

Shooting for an attendance this June of over 8,000, the Indiana All-Star basketball teams will work on extending their current dominance over the Kentucky High School All-Stars.

The World Series of High School Basketball will send the Hoosiers against the Bluegrass squads June 16 in Bowling Green, KY on the Western Kentucky University court. A week later action resumes in the 67-year-old series in Conseco Fieldhouse on June 23.

Larry Pringle, Triton Central, and Mike Miller, Lawrence Central, are directing the Indiana girls' and boys' squads respectively.Pringle will be as-

sisted by Marty Niehaus of Forest Park and Curt Bell of New Castle. Jerry Bomholt, Shawe Memorial, and Murray Mendenhall, Fort Wayne Wayne, will aid Miller.

Indiana's boys have won 14 of the past 16 games with Kentucky, including sweeps in 2006, 2005, 2003, 2002, 2000 and 1999. The all-time boys record has Indiana with a 77-41 series lead.

The news is just as good for the girls. After trailing Kentucky in the series 21-11 in 1991, the Indiana team has taken 22 of the past 28 games to move out ahead in the series, 34-28, including sweeps in 2006, 2004, 2000, 1999, 1996, 1995, 1994, and 1993.

The series with Kentucky's boys began in 1940 after the first Indiana boys' team defeated the state high school champions from Frankfort, 31-21, in 1939. This part of the interstate rivalry has been played every year since except for an interruption during the World War II years of 1943 and 1944.

The girls' series began and made the annual confrontations double-headers in 1976 when the inaugural game was a Kentucky 59-48 win in Louisville's Freedom Hall. A week later Indiana turned the tables behind its first Miss Basketball Judi Warren, 68-55,in Market Square Arena.

This spring marks the first year in the series' history when The Indianapolis Star has sponsored All-Star tryouts for the state's prestigious teams. A tryout for the Indiana girls' team was held for 40 candidates on March 4th, and a similar tryout for boys was conducted March 25, both at Ben Davis High School. The decision to conduct its own tryouts was generally warmly received by the state's coaches.

Net proceeds from those tryouts were split between The Indianapolis Star's Lend A Hand Fund, which receives the revenue from the All-Star games and related activities, and the Scholarship Fund managed by the Indiana
